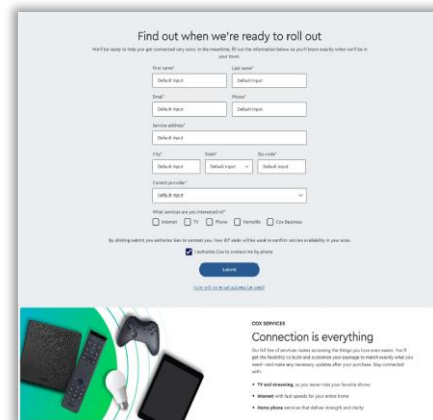
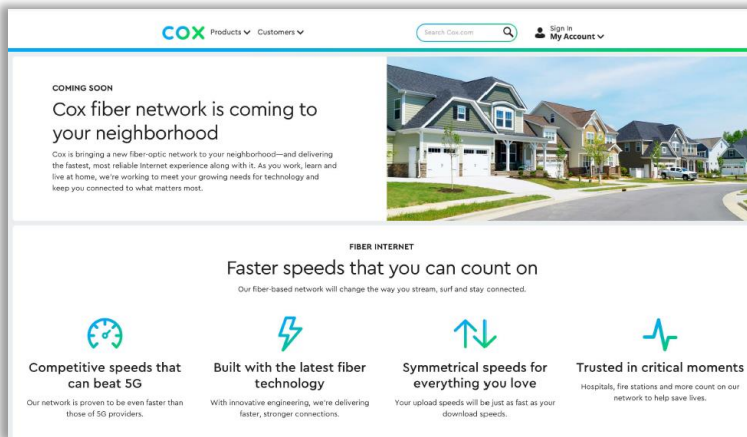

The communities of IronOaks, Cottonwood and Palo Verde will soon have access to Cox gig speed internet

PHOENIX—Cox Communications has announced that they will bring Cox gig internet, TV, phone, and home security and automation services, as well as business services to more than 7800 residents in the Sun Lakes community. Projected service availability for Phase I is this summer.

Cox has begun engineering, construction design and necessary permitting for its fiber-based network and will be working with state and county officials, along with the local impacted HOAs to obtain necessary approvals. 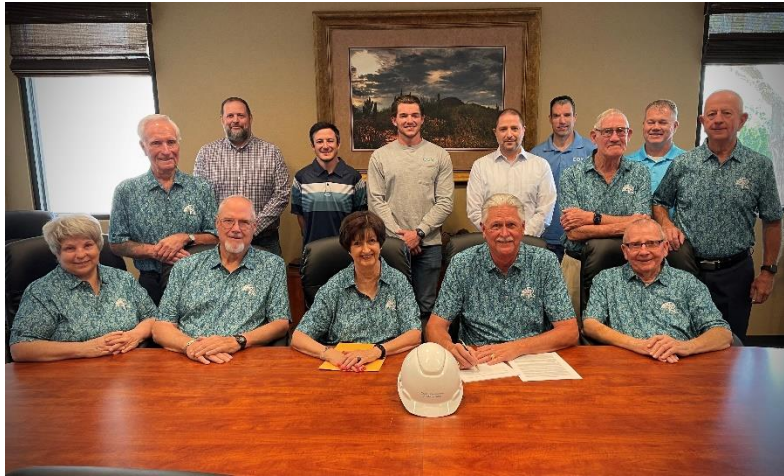

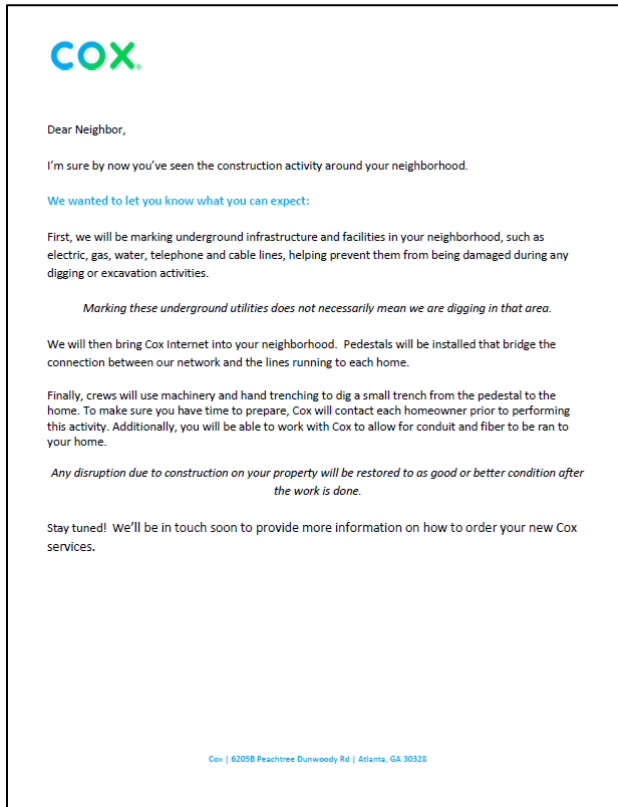
